WE GROW IN FAITH

"When we hear the cries of the world, the covenant whispers back: you are not alone."

Introduction to the Scripture:

Our readings today are tender yet powerful texts. Psalm 51 is the raw cry of a heart aching for cleansing, a confession that longs for renewal and mercy. Exodus 32 drops us into a moment of divine tension, when the people's rebellion threatens to undo everything, and yet God, moved by compassion, chooses mercy over wrath. Together, these readings invite us to wrestle with what it means to be both broken and beloved, to see how divine compassion responds to human failing and to ask what kind of hearts we must cultivate in a world that is hurting.
