We want your opinions and advice on the potential redevelopment of our west wing, a move that would create a new building with rental housing and new community space for the TSP Centre.

On November 9 (after worship) Trinity-St. Paul's will hold a congregational meeting to seek your support for entering into a feasibility study on the project with our partner, Kindred Works, which has been tasked by the United Church to look at alternative uses of surplus church property.
