Acknowledgment of Traditional Territory

Introduction to the Scripture

Today's reading is a reminder that we are called to compassion, even when it challenges us. Psalm 147 sings in praise that God rewards not strength, but mercy; in Matthew 25, Christ calls righteous those who feed the hungry and stand by the imprisoned. Finally, Matthew 26 makes clear that to stand together takes commitment to effort beyond words, as we hear Jesus pray in Gethsemane.

Scripture: Psalm 147:1-11 (VU 868-869, pt 1) Noah Antoniuk (they/them)

R: Sing to God in great thanksgiving.

How good it is to sing praises to God, how pleasant to laud the Most High. You are building Jerusalem, O God, and gathering the scattered exiles of Israel.

You are healing the broken-hearted, and binding up their wounds.

You count the number of the stars, and call them all by their names.

Great are you, O God, and mighty your power; yes, and your wisdom is infinite.

You raise up the lowly,

and bring down the wicked to dust. R
