We Remember Jim Lewis

Today, we enter a sacred moment of remembering.

We remember not statistics or distant history,

but lives, beloved, rooted, local, and connected to this very community of faith.

We remember the men and women of Avenue Road Presbyterian, St. Paul's Methodist, Trinity Methodist, St. Paul's Avenue Road, and Trinity United Church whose service in times of war shaped this congregation's story.

Some returned home carrying wounds seen and unseen.

Some did not return, and their absence reshaped families, friends, and futures.

As we call these names, and as music holds us,

may we remember with humility, gratitude, and a renewed commitment to the work of peace in our time.

Those who served in the the First World War (1914-1918):

- From Avenue Road Presbyterian Church: 73 men and 3 women enlisted; 12 men and 1 woman died in service. They are: Bernal B. Brown; Charles H. David; Thomas S. Freebairn; John A. Gordon; David E. Haig; Herbert Mann; William McDonald; Mary Agnes McKenzie; William Proudfoot; David Rae; Adam Robertson; A. Wallace Scott; Roy Ward.
- From St. Paul's Methodist Church: 154 men and 1 woman served; 22 men died in service. They are: Samuel H. Allen, Clifford E. Armstrong, Frank Bradley, William H. Brennan, George W. Edmison; John Houston; Gordon B. Irving; Walter H. Jamieson; Eric F. Johnston; George Johnstone; Maurice Kennedy; Richard G. Kirby; Frederic H. Langston; Austin R. Lapp; George A McEwen; John C. Newcombe; John T. K. Newman; George H. Parrett; Roy Seaman; W. Albert Simons; Frank M. Spooner; William A. Sutterby; Merrill Taylor; John W. Tribble; William R. Vohmaan; Edward Webster; Chester M. Willey.

Those who served in the Second World War (1939-1945):

• From St. Paul's Avenue Road: church minutes show "a considerable number of men" from the congregation enlisted, with at least four losing their lives. They are: L. O. Brown; E. Douglas Todd; Jean Lois Todd; Stanley Walker.

• From Trinity United Church: 217 men and 13 women served; 16 men died in service. They are: Albert Bell; George Walter Bouck; Paul Douglas Colbourne; James Fairhead; John M. Kelly; H. J. TRINITY: HONOURING SERVICE AND SACRIFICE

Trinity Methodist and Trinity United commemorated the service and sacrifice of their members differently, shaped by the historical context and evolving attitudes that changed perceptibly in the short period between the two world wars.

TRINITY METHODIST: FIRST WORLD WAR MEMORIAL TABLET AND TRINITY WAR BOOK

Trinity Methodist leaders, in keeping with practices of the time, directed how the war was to be memorialized. They commissioned an impressive bronze memorial tablet that was unveiled on May 19, 1920 (and which now hangs outside the Memorial Room). It features the names of 253 men and five women from the congregation who enlisted. The center arch has the names, places, and death dates of the 28 men who lost their lives, serving as a solemn and stark reminder of their sacrifice.

Oliver Hezzelwood, a Trinity member and national Methodist leader, compiled the Trinity War Book (1921), a unique collection of firsthand accounts of war as experienced by those who served.

TRINITY UNITED: SECOND WORLD WAR MEMORIAL ROOM AND BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

Canadian veterans of the second war had greater voice in how the war and their service were to be remembered. They favoured public projects like memorial arenas and libraries that had community benefits over local honour rolls and tablets. Trinity United veterans proposed a war memorial project to "serve our community and our times." Launched in 1947, the project raised more than \$8,000 (equivalent to \$116,224.00 today) to renovate existing boardrooms and to create a kitchenette, to meet congregation and community needs.

Instead of a memorial tablet, a more modest Book of Remembrance was prepared featuring the names of the 16 men who died, along with names of the 217 men and 13 women who served. This book is now preserved at the United Church Archives. The Book of Remembrance and Memorial Room were dedicated by Rev. Colonel George Fallis on November 9, 1947.

While the congregations remembered the wars in different ways, the common thread was the solemn gratitude for the sacrifices made by those who served and an overwhelming desire to create lasting and tangible memorials.
