You ask: Where do we seek joy in God's world, when the peace of angels eludes us?

I answer: We are temporary, even with our feet firmly planted on the ground. We are not of this world. Ask yourself, what is joy made of? The satisfaction of a life well lived? Of having made the lives of others better? Of having had the foresight to live well?

Joy is a scarce resource, a syllable, a whisper on open lips. You will know when you have it. You'll shout out, "Oh Joy! I see you, the beating of golden wings drawing thin shadows against a setting sun, an aria on Gabriel's trumpet."

I ask: Where are you going?

You answer: To seek hope, to seek joy. Far from here.

From here, I have seen them abandon young and old, and fly to unknown places filled with darkness. I could have taken them in flight, then I thought better of it.

I will follow them. I will find where they nest, where they are buried with worms and mushrooms, where they hide beneath the ocean, inside rusted ships bedecked with pearls and algae.

I ask: And what will you do when you find them?

You answer: I will keep joy in a gilded cage. I will build her an altar atop a mountain, beyond the reach of those malcontents who would

ruin them out of pain or madness. I will keep them pure, intact, adored by worthy pilgrims.

I ask: And hope, where will hope be?

You answer: Hope will be the privilege of those who desire the joy that is unattainable to them.

I say: Joy and hope are for everyone, and if you possess them, you must share them as you share the pain of others. You cannot find them in flight or at the bottom of the sea. Joy and hope are not destiny, reserved for a fortunate few who pursue them. They cannot be locked away on a mountaintop. They must live in fragments and glimpses, on frozen

tundra and scorching deserts. They must find a home in the hearts and minds of God's creatures, even in calamities and tribulations.

You say: And joy? And hope?

I answer: Embark on your journey, to live your life as it comes. Come back to share what you've learned, and if anyone responds with joy and hope, let it spread, let it multiply tenfold in your story.

Joy and hope are not destiny... they are intention.
