#### **Acknowledgment of Traditional Territory**

As we gather in this holy place during the season of Advent joy, we remember that long before we lit these candles of hope and expectation, this land was a meeting place, a home, and a sacred trust for many Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island. #### **Advent Wreath Lighting: Candle of Joy**

In the midst of our waiting and longing for God to make the world right again, we cling to the truth that God has saved, God is saving, and God will save. So today, we join our voices with the prophet Isaiah, who calls us to live in the joy of the truth of God's salvation.

We choose to believe that the day is coming when "the ransomed of the God shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away." (Isaiah 35:10)

We light this candle of joy as a sign of the Truth that sets us free to live in joy as we wait and work for the day when all creation will flourish together. [Light the third candle – pink]

Come, Jesus, Joy of the world. Be born in us again.

#### Words of Welcome

Welcome to this contemplative worship service on the third Sunday of Advent. Whether you are joining us here in the sanctuary or online from home, we greet you in the spirit of Joy.
