Acknowledgment of Traditional Territory

As we assemble in this holy place, we remember that long before we were called here today, this land was already known, named, and cherished as a sacred gathering place by many Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island. We honour the First Peoples of this land and offer particular recognition to the Mississaugas of the Credit, whose traditional territory we share. In this season of Epiphany, when God's call is revealed and voices are heard, we listen for the truths that continue to rise from this land. We hear the ongoing cries for justice from Indigenous communities, calling us toward right relationship, repair, and hope.

**As treaty people, we receive this call with humility and courage:
to listen deeply,
to learn faithfully,
and to walk together in the work of justice and reconciliation,
trusting that God still calls us, here and now, to live into light made known.**

- **Other Leadership Roles:**
 - **Member-at-Large:** Brings independent listening and voice to the Board discussions and decisions.
 - **Regional Council Representative:** Acts as a liaison between our congregation and the wider church. TSP is allowed two representatives.
 - **Chair of the Children's Circle:** Supports the spiritual life and programming for children.
 - **Co-Chair of Worship & Faith Formation:** Shapes worship and faith development (we are seeking two co-chairs).
